
Up Your Game

For the sports nut, it really doesn't get any better than a trip to Fenway Park. But while your posse is trying to scalp tickets, bunk at the Hotel Commonwealth in Back Bay, just steps from the ballpark. As hospitality's equivalent of a homerun, the hotel's Ultimate Bucket List package scores you overnight accommodations for two in the Baseball Suite (trickedout in serious sports memorabilia);

two front-row tickets to a Red Sox game (facing the visitors' ondeck circle, no less); on-the-field VIP access to batting practice: a personal photo with the 2013 World Championship trophy; an overflowing welcome basket; and valet parking. (Yes, it starts at \$2,495, but with all the perks, it might as well be priceless.) Pre- or post-game, make new friends downstairs at hip Eastern

bistro, where you can enjoy upscale bites from the beautiful raw bar, as well as samplesorry, have to!-wicked-awesome cocktails. The Commonwealth recently unveiled several other new themed suites-one fashioned after legendary rock club The Rathskeller (which once stood where the Commonwealth now is) and a high-ceiling urban artist's loft featuring local artwork. Major renovations in May mean that all 149 guest rooms were restyled



by New York's Dash Design and is now Boston's only hotel to bestow each one with an in-room concierge app and tablet. How's that for connections? From \$288 per night, hotelcommonwealth. com; easternstandardboston.com, @hotelcommonwith



Best Bites

If it's warm weather, outdoor dining is the way to go in Boston. The streets? Packed to the gills. South End hot spot B&G Oysters, from beloved Barbara Lynch Gruppo, is a hidden gem built into the side of a historic townhome. Along with lobster BLTs and a highly curated oyster list (Washington's Dabob Bays that sometimes make the menu are retrieved by divers who make a 30-foot descent to snag them) is a rockin' craft-beer lineup. All told, it's the perfect place for a boozy, I'm-on-vacation lunch. Smoked shrimp beignets with tomato sauce, bluefish rillettes and thin clam chowder with an unforgettable spicy crouton are the don't-miss appetizers. bandgoysters.com, @blgruppo

If you're near Beacon Hill, check out Cheers bar; the Boston Common; and, when hunger hits, swing by Scampo. Legendary chef Lydia Shire set up shop at the swanky Liberty Hotel (a former prison with, stay with me, loads of ambience) to show off her creative menu. In keeping with the behind-bars theme, Scampo means "escape" in Italian, but trust us, you won't want to leave-its handmade pastas shine. You also can't go wrong with a seasonal brunch including a croque madame with Gruyere, Muenster and Membrillo washed down with a refreshing Pesca (white peach puree and sparkling rose). scampoboston.com, @scampoliberty

On the other side of the law is a new offering on the Back Bay scene, **Precinct Kitchen + Bar**. Situated in the basement of the old city precinct, the bar is packed with the see-and-be-seen set.
